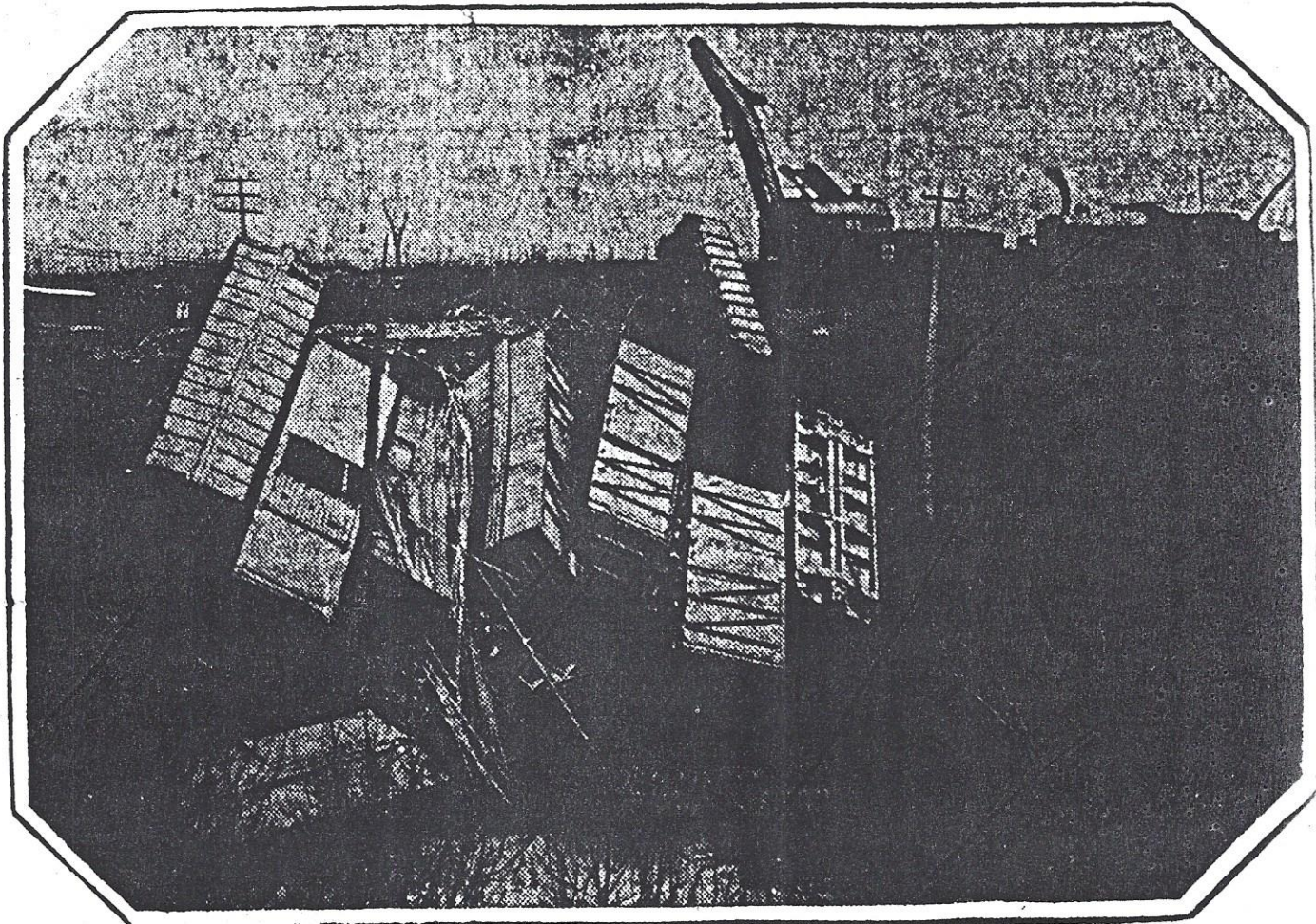

TRAINMEN HAD CLOSE CALL IN THE SPILL



Train schedules were thrown into confusion on the Hamilton-St. Catharines run, after a C. N. freight train had become derailed near Peachland, March 31. No one was injured, but 19 cars left rails, causing considerable damage. The cars were strewn on either side of the track, one car falling into 15-Mile creek. Trainmen had a narrow escape.
