THE DUNKIN ACT.

A petition with over 2,000 signers was presented to the County Council of the County of York, at its session just closed, asking that a By-law be passed to submit the Dunkin Act to the electors for their decision thereon. The council

Mr. Richardson introduced a by-law appointing Messrs. Andrew Young and Arch. Glendenning, Auditors', which was read three times and passed. Mr. Chester in the chair.

Mr. Tredway, seconded by Mr. Morgan, moved that the Revo sign on behalf of the Corporation, the petition to the Hon. Oliver Mowat, Attorney-General, praying for relief from the impositions practised by the Toronto & Nipissing Railway Company, and that the seal of the Corporation be attached to the petition.

Mr. Tredway introduced a by-law appointing Mr. John P. Wheeler, Jr., Assessor for the current year at \$80 read three times and passed. Mr. Morgan in the chair.

Mr. Morgan, seconded by Mr. Richardson, moved that the Treasurer be and is hereby authorized to pay the account of the Toronto General Hospital, amounting to \$164 as per account rendered up to January 1st, 1877.

Mr. Chester, seconded by Mr. Morgan, moved that Mr. Richardson be and is hereby authorized to have erected a fence to enclose the gravel pit on sideroad between Lots 34 and 35, Con. A, and also to take such steps as he sees fit to prosecute such parties as may be found taking gravel therefrom.

Mr. Morgan gives notice that he will at next meeting of this council introduce a by-law for appointing township officers for the year 1877.

Mr. Chester, seconded by Mr. Tredway, moved that the Treasurer do pay to James Fleming the sum of \$6 for the burial expenses of Jane Richardson, as ordered by the ex-Teevee.

Mr. Richardson, seconded by Mr. Morgan, moved that this council do now adjourn to meet again on Monday, the 12th day of February next.
